## 1. MINUTES

The Minutes of the previous meeting held on 21 October 2013, copies of which had been circulated, were approved as a correct record and signed by the Chairman.

# 2. <u>APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE</u>

Apologies for absence were received from Anne Dodge, Maurice Lamb, Mike Lock and Sue Pitman.

# 3. CORRESPONDENCE

There were no items of correspondence but Steve Fox reported that SSDC had received 24 compliments for Yeovil in Bloom over the summer.

## 4. FEEDBACK FROM SOUTH WEST IN BLOOM MEETING

Lesley Jelleyman updated the group on the affiliation of South West in Bloom with the RHS (Royal Horticultural Society) and explained that the logo and name would be changing in the near future – "Britain in Bloom – South West".

She said that only three "It's Your Neighbourhood" entries would be visited as part of the judging tour and that due to the volume of "It's Your

Neighbourhood" entries, they may need to be capped. Lesley added that 2014 would be the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of South West in Bloom.

# 5. YEOVIL IN BLOOM - UPDATE

Lesley Jelleyman informed the group that the planting of 1000 bulbs had taken place in King Arthur Drive. She added that there had been a litter picking/forest school event in association with Knightstone Housing; and that ideas for a community open space/allotment space were being developed in Larkspur.

Lesley also distributed to the group pictures of an idea for tree knitting and it was suggested that this could be used in Sidney Gardens.

# 6. YEOVIL IN BLOOM - UPDATE

Steve Fox updated the group on the winter work of the Yeovil in Bloom team, including work with schools and the design of a community garden.

Steve stated that the last visit to the foyer had included work by the foyer gardening group on the adjacent Almhouses which had forged beneficial links. Work had also taken place on the Armoury beds – on the right hand side of Park Road and there was an idea to create a visual feature adjacent to the seating in the centre of Middle Street.

# 7. PROPOSED DESIGNS FOR 2014

Steve Fox provided proposed designs for the flowerbeds and displays, summarised as follows:

St. Johns Churchyard: Raised beds with Poppy/Great War logo and a bountiful/lush surrounding. Logos - Sedum, Ajuga Chocolate Chip, Alternathera. Surrounding - Richis, Cosmos, Heliotrope, Dianthus, Phlox.

Town House: Slightly tropical - using Richis, Eragostris, Verbena.

Bond Street: Community allotment similar to last year.

Petters Way: Community allotment.

Hospital Roundabout: Big, bold and colourful – using Phlox, Marigold, Cosmos, Nicotiana.

Police Station Roundabout: Purple - using Verbana, Dianthus, Cosmos.

War Memorial: Box hedge/short sunflowers - using Sunflower teddy bear, Dianthus Black Cherry.

Westland's Roundabout: Yellow/orange using Marigolds.

Lynx Roundabout: Simply a jungle. Cycas, bamboos, bananas, Canna Carex.

Asda Roundabout: Britain in Bloom 50 years - using Marigolds, Begonia, gravel, resin letters.

*Ilchester Roundabout:* Annual mix, poppies with later sowing.

Western Avenue: Permanent planting, re-landscaped this spring.

Alvington/SSH Roundabout: Sunflower centre - using 4 x sunflower species, Phlox, Dianthus.

Tamburinos: Annual mix, poppies with later sowing.

Vegetable tubs: Similar to last year.

## 6. CHRISTMAS LIGHTS COMPETITION

Each year Yeovil Town Council runs a Christmas lights competition to acknowledge the efforts made by residents to brighten up their neighbourhoods for the festive season with outdoor lights at their property. Last year it was agreed to invite neighbouring parishes to be included in the competition, and Yeovil Without came on board, which extended the area of the competition, making more properties eligible to enter.

The competition was advertised through a press release and letters of invitation to participate in the competition were sent out to 40 previous entrants. Entrance forms were also posted through letterboxes of houses that had made an effort with a lighting display and Yeovil Without Parish Council publicised the competition in their area. Judging took place on 9 December. The judges were the Mayor of Yeovil Councillor Manny Roper, Councillor Wes Read, Councillor Jon Gleeson (Chairman of the Promotions & Activities Committee), Councillor Iris Coton of Yeovil Without Parish Council, excouncillor and trophy donor Audrey Bartlett, and Emma Slee (Editor of the Western Gazette).

The winners this year were Mr and Mrs Cox of Rowan Way, and the runnersup were Mr and Mrs Penny of Freedom Avenue and Emily Oakes of Highfield Road. Presentations took place at the meeting of Yeovil Town Council held on 7 January 2014 where the winner was awarded the cup and small shields were presented to the above top three entrants. The overall winner also received a prize of a new set of outdoor lights, which was kindly provided by Brimsmore Garden Centre (The Garden's Group).

The press release issued in November 2013 to announce the event stated that nominated displays must be located within the Borough of Yeovil Town, or Yeovil Without Parish Council, but enquiries were also received from residents in the area administered by Brympton Parish Council. The invitation was extended to both neighbouring parishes (Brympton and Yeovil Without) to have their area included in the competition, however Brympton Parish Council declined.

The administration of the competition was undertaken by our Trainee Administrator Lauren Park and she is to be congratulated on her hard work to accomplish all the detailed arrangements, including obtaining the donation of the prize for first place.

The Committee is **RECOMMENDED** to note the report and consider whether any changes should be made to the future running of the competition.
